



Child-Parent Psychotherapy

2026-2027 Training Opportunity

The FSU Center for Prevention and Early Intervention Policy is excited to continue building therapeutic capacity to serve young children and their families in Florida by offering Child-Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) training. It is one of the most effective, evidence-based interventions to help young children 0-5 and families recover and heal after stressful and traumatic events.

Training Requirements

CPP training is an intensive time commitment for agencies and their clinicians being trained. Applicants should have a keen knowledge of early childhood development, infant mental health, and good clinical skills and should meet the following criteria:

- Doctoral or Master's level psychotherapist with a degree in a mental health discipline and be licensed or licensable.
- Attend 20-months of virtual trainings and consultation calls.
- Provide CPP to children under the age of 6.
- Have the support of your agency who will provide you with bi-weekly reflective supervision.
- If you are in private practice, be willing to be a part of a reflective consultation group.

Training Dates

Pre-training: October 8, 2026

Learning Session 1: November 9, 10, 12, & 13, 2026

Learning Session 2: Three virtual training days (May 2027)

Learning Session 3: Three virtual training days (November 2027)

Training Cost

The cost of the 18-month training is \$4300 per person.

Tuition is due September 4, 2026.
